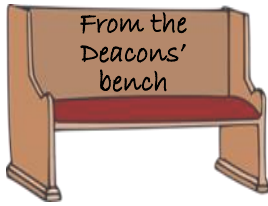

## Session Highlights for MARCH 2025

The February Session meeting was held on March 4, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the library/classroom. Kemper Dyson led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship continued to be in person but was also offered live at 10:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance was as follows:

The following Consent Agenda Items were Approved:

1. The minutes of the February 4, 2025 Session meeting.
2. The minutes of the February 15, 2025 Deacon meeting.
3. The Treasurer's reports for January and February 2025.
4. The Minutes of the Spring Congregational/Corporation meeting held on February 16, 2025.
5. The Email vote to allow a special offering on February 16 & 23 for the Family Shelter.
6. Rev. James Richwine to preside over the baptism of Killick Hayes Weyant-Staver, Son of Colton Staver and Brett Weyant and Maeve Marie Dial, daughter of Alannah Staver Dial and Nate Dial on May 4, 2025.
7. The following was pulled for further discussion: The offering for Rose Leitner's concert on June 14 will be split between St. Jude's Research (75%) and Rose (25%). It was noted that a 1099 would need to be issued if Rose received \$600 or more because of tax regulations.

PNC Update: It was noted that the committee has reviewed 43 matches from the Church Leadership Connection (CLC). Of those 43 matches, 12 have declined, 13 were not considered good for our congregation, 18 more to look over. We have had 6 self-referrals, but 4 were not considered good for our congregation and 1 withdrew the application. We have one self-referral left. We are still working very hard to get the best fit from all the matches and self-referrals.

Pastor Ed will be on vacation from April 21 through May 4.

The resignation of our secretary, Rebecca Jordan, was accepted with regret. Interviews for a new secretary will begin within the next couple of weeks.

The wood from the downed trees was delivered to the Shirk's Sawmill. We received \$137 for the wood.

A proposal from Mike Denning to purchase new sound mics for the choir loft was approved at a cost of \$2396.85. These mics will help with the sound for the livestream. Sunrise Electronics will provide the mics and installation.

A proposal for a technology cabinet that will be placed in the narthex was approved. A proposal for a new picture frame for the past pastors was approved (the current one is full). The combined cost for the cabinet and frame is \$2950.00. Boyd's Cabinet Shop will build the cabinet and frame.

The Puppet Ministry will present a program on Palm Sunday. It was proposed to have this during worship. Details to follow.

At the February 27 Community Meal, 10 in-person meals were served (it was noted that 3 new people ate with us), 69 drive-thru meals were served (it was noted that 4 new cars went through the drive-thru, and 35 meals were given to the Family Shelter.

The **Presbyterian Women's Bible Study** will meet at 1:00 on Tuesday, April 15 in the library. We will continue with Lesson #6 from The Book of Malachi.



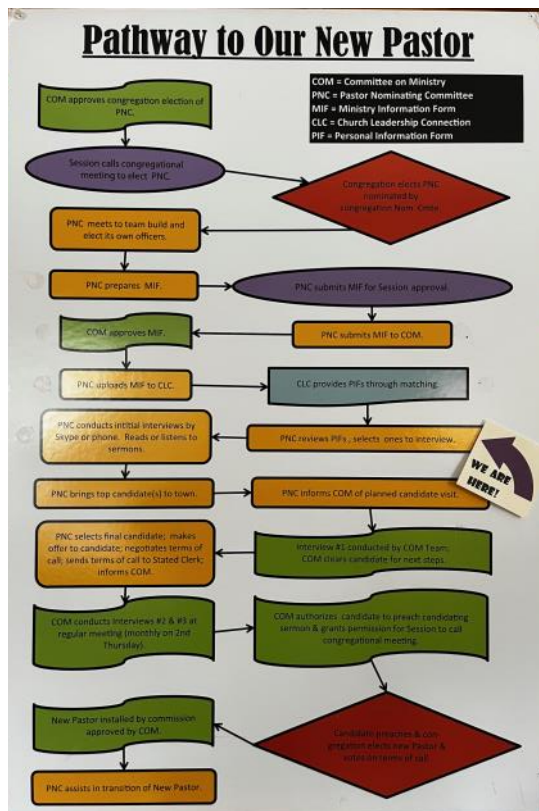

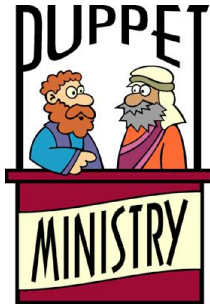

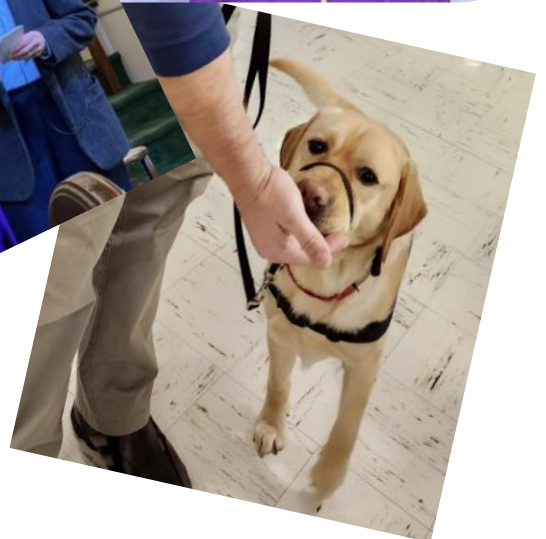
