

supplies, dry/canned goods, children's snacks, towels, cooking oil, bleach, and paper products are needed by the families. Follow their posts on Facebook!!



Session Highlights for March 2024

The March Session meeting was held on March 5 in the Library/Meeting Room at 6:00 PM. Don Cover led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship and the Ash Wednesday service during February continued to be in person but were also offered live at 10:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance was as follows:

The following Consent Agenda Items were Approved:

- 1. The minutes of the Session meeting on February 6, 2024.
- 2. The February Treasurer's Report was approved. Year-to-date Income \$55,317.26; Year-to-date Expenses \$72,577.06; Checkbook Balance \$98,463.03; Available Cash \$45,032.95; E-giving to date \$4,234.27.
- 3. The minutes of the Deacon meeting of February 13, 2024.
- 4. The minutes of the Congregational Meeting on February 18, 2024.
- 5. Vacation request by Pastor Ed for April 1 through April 14.
- 6. Moving the April Session meeting to April 16, 2024.
- 7. The email vote to have the Special Presbytery meeting at Middle Spring on March 11.

There were 50 in-person meals, 4 drive-thru meals, and a large container was given to the Family Shelter at the February 22 Community Meal.

The Designated Offerings for February went to the Presbytery Relief Fund for Gaza. \$380 was collected for this cause.

A Special Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, March 17, 2024, following worship. The purpose of the meeting was to nominate the PNC and to add an amendment to the By-Laws about Electronic Meetings.

An Ad Hoc committee was formed to update the Funeral and Wedding policies.

The Memorial Fund procedures, that are included in the Financial Data Booklet, will be updated.

Don Cover announced the Puppet Program for Easter to be held on March 23 was canceled.
