Rich is a retired Principal from the Chambersburg Area School District. He also was the interim Director of the Grace B. Luhrs Elementary School, Shippensburg University and a supervisor of student teachers for Wilson College.

Rich and his wife Vickie have been married for 45 years and reside in Shippensburg. In retirement, they enjoy taking ocean and river cruises with their most recent ones being a Nile River cruise in Egypt last year and the Panama Canal this past January. Additionally, they love and enjoy spending time with their family. They are also the proud parents of two adult married daughters and four grandchildren.

Session Highlights for APRIL 2025

The April Session meeting was held on April 1, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the library/classroom. Don Cover led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship continued to be in person but was also offered live at 10:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance for March was as follows:

The following Consent Agenda Items were Approved:

- 1. The minutes of the March 4, 2025 Session meeting.
- 2. The minutes of the March 11, 2025 Deacon meeting.
- 3. The worship time for Easter Sunday will be at 10:00 AM with no Sunday School.
- 4. Tammy Maclay requested that we collect health kits and personal hygiene kits in July and food donations in August as part of our sponsorship for the migrant camp. We do this through Fruitbelt Farmworker Christian Ministry.
- 5. Rev. Jamie McLeod will lead worship on April 27, and Kemper Dyson will lead worship on May 4 in Pastor Ed's absence.
- 6. Worship time for the summer will be 9:30 AM from June 1 through September 7.

Rick Bradford from Operation Christmas Child will present a Moment for Mission to highlight the purpose of the program.

Several estimates were presented for repairing, sealing, and striping the parking lots, but no action was taken.

A proposal was presented to repair and enclose the kitchen porch. It was decided that members of the congregation could remove the roof and wait for another proposal to compare costs before proceeding.

A new garage door and opener for the shed were approved at a cost of \$1235 from Cumberland Garage Doors.

A maintenance agreement with Wadels for the mini-splits was approved for \$960.

Lisa Laughlin was hired as the new secretary at \$18 per hour for 20 hours a week. She will begin on April 22. Rebecca will train her for 2 weeks or longer if needed.

The Memorial Day Service program has been finalized. Ret. LTC Richard Bonitz will be the speaker.

The Group Mission Trips canceled the Youth Mission Trip to Bloomington, IL. Jason is looking at other Mission Trip options.

The chairs around the communion table will be replaced by 2 Cherry Chairs from Blue Mountain Woodcraft, LLC., at a cost of \$710, which will be paid from the Memorial Fund.

New Choir Folders are needed. Anyone who would like to sponsor a folder in memory or honor of a loved one will have the opportunity to do so. The cost will be determined, and an announcement will be made when you can start donating. The money will go to the Memorial Fund.

A Children's Church is being explored. The program will run from September through May. More information about the program will be forthcoming.

At the March 27 Community Meal, 8 in-person meals were served, 68 drive-thru meals were served, and 30 meals were given to the Family Shelter.

Lend A Hand recently returned from our first trip out to the western part of North Carolina. We worked in a home near the town of Canton, NC, which lies west of Asheville. There is a tremendous amount of work still to be done in the area. As with most disaster sites, the rebuilding will take 6-10 years. We

are hopefully that we will be able to establish a relationship with one of the PDA sites in the area which will be opening up in May.

In January, we worked in the eastern part of the state once again and were able to finish work on a home damaged from the 2018 hurricane. We have four trips scheduled for the remainder of the year. The week of April 27 we will be returning to the eastern NC area once again. We have trips scheduled for Sept. 7-13, Oct. 5-11 and Nov. 9-15. These trips will be going to NC although which side is yet to be determined. 
