


This is an event where kids collect candy from cars decorated in Halloween themes and are a popular alternative to traditional door-to-door trick-or-treating.



Session Highlights for SEPTEMBER 2025

The September Session meeting was held on September 2, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the fellowship hall. Jill Corwin led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship continued to be in person but was also offered live at 10:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance for August was as follows:

The following Consent Agenda Items were approved:

- The minutes of the June 24, 2025, Session meeting.
- The Treasurer's Report for:
 - June Year-to-date income \$170,588.14; Year-to-date expenses \$181,031.93; Checkbook Balance \$7,344.78; Available cash \$10,719.06; E-Giving Year-to-date \$15,367.83; Capitol Fund Year-to-date income \$15,702.44 (\$14,400 from Unrestricted Fund); Capital Fund Year-to-date expenses \$17,306.04; and Capital Fund available cash \$136.20.
 - ~ **July** Year-to-date income \$208,522.16; Year-to-date expenses \$215,484.20; Checkbook Balance \$61,337.13; Available Cash \$14,504.86; E-Giving Year-to-date \$17,970.58; Capital Fund Year-to-date \$15,702.70 (\$14,400 from Unrestricted Funds/Building Fund); Year-to-date expenses \$17,306.04; Capital Fund available cash \$136.58.
- The White tables and chairs may be requested for use by congregation members. You must contact the Chair of the Building and Grounds to sign out the tables and chairs. A maximum of 6 tables and 30 chairs may be requested for use and must be returned to the church within 48 hours of picking them up.
- Thermostats are to remain at 78 degrees during the summer months and at 65 degrees during the winter months. The window blinds on the manse side of the CE building must remain closed during the summer months and open during the winter months. Instructions are placed near or on the remotes.
- At the June 26 Community Meal, 4 in-person meals were served, 69 drive-thru meals were served, and 30 meals were given to the Family Shelter. At the July 24 Community Meal, 7 in-person meals were served, 58 drive-thru meals were served, and an additional 30 meals were sent to the Family Shelter. At the August 28 Community Meal, 11 in-person meals were served, 86 drive-thru meals, and 30 meals were sent to the Family Shelter.
- A new Middle Spring Fact Pamphlet is being prepared.
- A new chest freezer was approved to be purchased at Appliance Hub for \$649, plus \$30 for disposing of the old freezer.
- The compressor for the mini-splits for the Library and Classroom was approved to be repaired.
- The Pastor Picture Frame will soon be placed in the CE Lobby with all the past Pastors included in the frame.
- It was noted that \$300 was sent to the Presbyterian Mission Agency, \$1050 for One Great Hour of Sharing, and \$64.20 for the Penecost Offering.

- The Nominating Committee is currently seeking nominations for Deacons for the Class of 2028. If you are interested in being a Deacon, please see Don Cover.
- The Youth group returned from their Mission Trip to Washington, D.C., very excited to return to the same area on July 11-17, 2026.



The Session has approved **all** thermostats to remain at 78 degrees in the summer and at 65 degrees in the winter. This will be less taxing on the compressors. If you need to change the temperature for some reason, be sure you go back to this setting as described on the information sheet that is attached to the remote or near the remote. To get to this setting, press mode and then auto, and the temperature will return to the preset temperature. DO NOT SHUT THE REMOTE OFF!!! In the summer, please lower the blinds on the windows of the CE wing (the office, pastor study, classroom and library) on the manse side to keep the area cool and raise them in the winter to allow the sunshine to warm the area.


What Do You Think About Artificial Intelligence and the Church?

If you're currently subject to taking an RMD from your rollover IRA or pension plan, you can make any part of your distribution non-taxable if you donate directly to Middle Spring Presbyterian Church. By giving directly from your IRA/pension to the church, the funds you pull out are not taxed, possibly reducing your overall tax bill while you continue making your charitable contribution to MSPC. Hummingbird Cake IV

3 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups white sugar

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 1/4 cups vegetable oil

3 eggs

1 (8 oz) can crushed pineapple w/juice

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

3/4 cup chopped pecans

1/4 cup chopped black walnuts

2/3 cup mashed bananas

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour three 9-in round cake pans.

Combine the flour, sugar, salt, ground cinnamon and baking soda. Add the oil and well-beaten eggs. Stir by hand until moistened. Stir in the vanilla, pineapple, nuts and bananas.

Spoon batter into the prepared pans. Bake for 25-30 minutes. Let cakes cool in pans for 10 minutes. Then turn onto a rack to cool. Frost with a cream cheese frosting.




