Session

Session Highlights for May 2023

The March Session meeting was held on May 16 in person in the large meeting room in the CE Area. Quay Stolte led us in devotion and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship in April continued to be in person but was also offered live at 10:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance was as follows:

April 2– 72 in person with 21 online; April 6 (Seder meal) 38 people present; April 9 (Sunrise) 54 people present; April 9 (worship) – 92 in person with 12 online; April 16 - 66 in person with 17 online; April 23– 76 in person with 18 online and April 30 – 81 in person with 28 online.

The community meal served 72 meals on April 27 - 13 meals were dined -in and 59 went through the drive-thru. We also sent 35 meals to the family homeless shelter.

The Treasurer's Report for April – Year-to-date Income - \$103,312.13; Year-to-date expenses-\$113,067.15.

Checkbook Balance - \$106,303.87; Available cash - \$62,130.34; year-to-date e-giving - \$11,466.30

The following Consent Agenda Items were Approved:

The minutes of the Session meeting on April 4, 2023; the minutes of the Board of Deacons meeting on April 11, 2023; the April Treasurer's report; changing the summer worship hours to 9:30 AM beginning June 4 thru Sept.3; an email vote to give a retirement gift to our Interim Executive Presbyter, Cheryl Galan; the disbandment of the Manse Renovation Team; a donation to Eloise Jumper, a friend of Joyce Russell, for community needs.

Kemper Dyson and Danny Chamberlin served as Commissioners to the April 18 and May 2 Presbytery Meeting.

The April 18 Commissioners voted on the Amendments to the Book of Order at the May 2 meeting there was a celebration of Cheryl Galan's retirement.

Sue Beidel presented a proposal to remove and replant shrubbery around the church. The proposal was approved pending the availability of resources at a cost of \$3000.

A small water heater was replaced in the furnace room.

A request from Ingrid Winckler to attend organ lessons at the Lebanon Valley College to acquire certification for the Colleague Certification from the American Guild of Organists was approved for \$500.


A Social Media Policy was approved and adopted to be followed when using all Social Media venues.

The Final report from the Manse Renovation Team indicated the project came in at \$7158.55 under budget.

The Fellowship/Outreach committee has been meeting regularly to prepare for an event each month. May 17 – Annual Memorial Day service at 6:30 PM; June 10 – Square Dancing and meal; June 23 – Movie Night and picnic; July 21 – Movie Night with a picnic; and August 18 – Movie Night and picnic.

A motion was made to have the Therapy Dog Program a once-a-year Designated Offering recipient.

Making Miracles Group Home

Phase II Group Home, Tallahassee, Florida

Making Miracles Group Home (MMGH) helps young mothers break the cycle of abusive relationships, addiction, incarceration and early motherhood—a repeating pattern that is difficult to break and overcome. Since its inception in 2010, MMGH has served over 100 women and their children by providing a one-year, live-in program designed to support young mothers and help them develop skills to live independently and care for their children.

Current eligibility criteria require residents to be pregnant and/or have a single child up to age three, but mothers who have a single child older than age three or multiple children often seek help. With the Birthday Offering grant, MMGH will purchase a second group home to serve an additional five families who are at risk of experiencing homelessness. With loving support and tools to establish stable, permanent housing, these families can look forward to a hopeful and successful future.

Berhane Yesus Elementary School

Kindergarten School Construction

Berhane Yesus Elementary School, located in the western highlands of Ethiopia, seeks to change lives by sharing the "Light of Jesus" and by providing the best possible educational experience for the children of Dembi Dollo. Berhane Yesus provides children with the possibility of a better future by preparing them for a rigorous high school education and a life of Christian service. The school is the first entry point to education for children of subsistence farmers, migrant workers and displaced groups of people.

This K-8th grade school has been serving the community and been a part of the Presbyterian Church in this rural community since 1921. A kindergarten was added to the school in 2012, but with no available space for class, the children met in the chapel. Over the years the number of kindergarten students has increased and now space of their own is not only needed but is required by the government to remain open. Western Wollega Bethel Synod provided land for the classroom and the Birthday Offering grant will provide all necessary funding for its construction.






